2006 LOCATION AWARDS

Please read the following carefully, competition rules differ with each competition. Failure to comply with the rules below could result in disqualification. If you need clarification of rules please call us at 617-548-9846 or visit us online www.amdance.com. Entry forms must be completed in their entirety. Studio Directors and/or ENTRIES MUST BE received in our office 28 days prior to competition date. Entries will be accepted on a first come. first served basis and will be limited to the amount of performance time available. There will be a \$5 late fee per routine. after deadline date. ENTRIES WILL NOT BE PROCESSED WITHOUT FULL PAYMENT. ONLY MONEY ORDERS OR CASHIER CHECKS WILL BE ACCEPTED. Individual personal or studio checks will not be honored. ADI reserves the right to add additional competition days or move the competition location due to unforeseen circumstances. ADI also reserves the right to cancel any event that does not meet the minimal number of acceptable entries. In the event this should occur all entry fees will be refunded. There will be NO refunds on entries after the minimum number of entries has been received and the competition has been confirmed. Admission is free and the general public is welcomed. No food, drinks or smoking is allowed in the contest area or inside the venue. All participating teachers, dancers and spectators are expected to display good sportsmanship. Failure to comply could result in immediate disqualification.

ADI, DANZ4KIDZ, NEDT and DANSE4U

programs offer the following awards at this season's locations.

OVERALL HI GH SCORE AWARDS

Overall High Score Winners are announced in all FOUR of our levels, PRIMARY, IN-TERMEDIATE, SECONDARY, and ELITE in the following dance categories: SOLO, DUO/ TRI O, SMALL GROUP, LARGE GROUP. CLASS AND PRODUCTION. The highest scoring routine in these divisions must score a GOLD/PLATINUM level status in order to be eligible. This is considered our FIRST PLACE for a dance category. High Score winners are awarded in JUNIOR (12 and under,) and SENIOR (13 and over) AGE CLASSIFI CATIONS. There must be a minimum of TEN entries in a category (for example there would have to be **TEN** primary soloists age 12 and under for an OVER ALL HIGH SCORE WINNER to be announced.) THREE placements will be announced, first runner-up, second runner up, and the winner. A trophy and cash award is presented to the studio of the winning routine, (cash awards as listed below) All routines that receive silver through platinum are eligible to compete in the Grand Finale held on Cape Cod June 25, 26 and 27th. Cash awards for this event are double the regional events. Soloists who place in the top three for a category become semi-finalists for the SOLO GRAND CHALLENGE CHAMPION AND ADI'S DANCER OF THE YEAR.

2006 RULES AND REGULATIONS

STUDIO OF THE YEAR

\$250 Award Certificate for the 2007 Competitive Season is presented to the School/Studio at a 2006 season location with the greatest number of entries and participants, for each dance level. A special award trophy is given.

PERFORMANCE PLUS AWARD

This award is given to the most entertaining entry from each dance studio duo through production that stands out to the judges. An invitation to perform at the OPENING NIGHT PERFORMANCE PLUS SHOW CASE, SUNDAY JUNE 25, 2006.

AMDANCE CHOREOGRAPHY AWARD

This award will be presented to the teacher of the highest scoring routine duo through class at the Intermediate, Secondary and Elite Levels, when each of the levels has 25 plus entries. A trophy is presented to the teacher and each member of the award winning team is presented with a special ribbon. A routine may win this award only **ONCE** during the 2006 season. Routines are eligible for this award if they have scored in the gold/platinum level status.

SOLO DANCE CHALLENGE CHAMPIONS ADI'S DANCER OF THE YEAR

A soloist may enter a maximum of **TWO** solos into 2006 location. The highest scoring entry, regardless of dance level, will be eligible for the location title. The title score is based on the performer's overall performance ability, personality and entertainment skills in addition to technique. Each title winner will receive a special trophy and An invitation to perform a special routine at the opening/closing night ceremonies for the Cape Cod final . **THERE IS NO ADDTI-TIONAL CHARGE FOR THIS TITLE.** Titles are awarded in the following age classifications:

CASH AWARDS PRESENTED

The following awards are presented at the Primary, Intermediate, Secondary, and Elite

All awards are presented at the event in certified funds. There must a minimum of **TEN** entries per category in order for the cash award to be presented otherwise a certificate will be presented.

EXCALI BUR GRAND CHAMPION AWARD

This award is given to the highest scoring winning entry, DUO through CLASS, from an entire regional location event. A routine may win this award only ONCE during the 2006 season, beginning with the January 2006 regional location. A \$100 CASH AWARD and a special trophy is given to the highest scoring routine in the intermediate, secondary, and elite levels. Level MUST have 25 entries for award to be given.

DANCE CHALLENGE CHAMPION

At the end of each session, just prior to announcement of awards, a dance challenge will be held for the top **THREE** scoring entries duo through class. Announcements will be made throughout each session and teachers will be notified what entries are eligible to perform in this final "challenge" for a location. A special trophy will be awarded.

DANCE LEVELS OF COMPETITION

PRI MARY LEVEL—Dancers who train two hours a week in any dance class, first year competitors, or dancers with 2 years of training in any dance style.. This level is for dancers who are at least 5 years of age and/or for dancers with no more than one year of competition experience.

INTERMEDIATE LEVEL—Dancers with 2 to 4 years of competition experience. If a dancer has 4 or more years of competition experience and is above the age 11, the SECONDARY LEVEL should be considered.

SECONDARY LEVEL—Dancers with 4 to 7 years of competition experience. If a dancer has 7 or more years of competition experience and is above the age 14, then the ELITE LEVEL should be considered.

ELITE LEVEL—Dancers at this level are at least 7 years of competition experience and generally 14 years of age or older. Dancers in the ELITE LEVEL should display higher technical skill and abilities then the SECON-DARY LEVEL dancers.

TYPE OF ENTRI ES

Solos, Duet/Trios (duets and trios will compete against each other), Small Group (4-7 performers), Large Group (8-14), Class (15 or more performers), Production (TEN or more dancers, time limit as stated. A production entry can have less than TEN dancers (no less than FIVE), however the entry fee will be that of TEN dancers. All entries will be eligible for the "High Score Production" award only. There must be at least THREE entries per location for this award to be given out.

TIME LIMITS

All routines must be limited to 3 minutes. Production routines have an 8 minute time limit. Dancers are expected to perform in the order published, unless the backstage director or event director grants special permission. Unauthorized delays of the performance schedule will result in a 5 point deduction and/or disgualification. Routines not completed will also receive a 5 point deduction. Re-performances that are not the result of a technical failure will not be re-adjudicated. A tentative schedule with the performance time of each act will be e-mailed email is our preferred method of contact) or mailed 7 to 10 days prior to the competition. Competing dancers must be ready to perform FORTY FIVE minutes prior to their scheduled performance time. If the competition is running ahead of schedule, dancers are expected to perform when called upon. One day events will be held on a SATURDAY. Two day events will be held SATURDAY AND SUNDAY.

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MUSI C

Each entry must furnish their music on a high quality, individual CD or cassette tape. All CDs or cassette tapes must contain only one song, recorded at their appropriate speed and properly cued. Song (Routine) title, name of dance studio, and entry number for the ADI location entered, must also be clearly marked. All acts must submit their music at the music table one half hour before the beginning of each session. Music can be picked up at the music table at the conclusion of each award presentation session. It is highly recommended that contestants bring back-up music in the event of a malfunction of the original CD/cassette tape submitted.

CATEGORI ES OF DANCE

ABSTRACT/ MODERN—Routines that demonstrates balance extension, isolation, and control. An Abstract style of movement, with or without a prescribed vocabulary. It can borrow from other disciplines (i.e., ballet, jazz, lyrical). It is based on such principles as space, force, weight and time. Modern/Abstract styling is often characterized to reflect the choreographer's vision or may be pure modern technique (i.e., Graham, Tharp).

ACRO/ **GYMNASTICS**—Routines using controlled movements and flexibility, walkovers, aerials, backhand springs, etc. Must incorporate dance technique.

BALLET—Routine should contain ballet technique incorporating classic movements. **FOLK/ ETHNI C**—Routine must utilize folkloric/ethnic style of dance such as Hawaiian, Spanish, Polkas and Clogging. **HIP HOP/ FUNK**—Routine demonstrating

street style of jazz that incorporates hip hop and/or funk choreography. Acrobatics and break dancing is permissible. JAZZ—Routine must consist of jazz tech-

LYRI CAL JAZZ—Routine consisting of dynamic emotion and expressive movements demonstrated with fluidity, balance, extension and control.

MUSI CAL THEATRE—Routines featuring any style of dance from a Broadway, Movie or Television Show.

OPEN—Routine demonstrating any dance style or combination of dance styles. **POINTE**—Routine must consist of Pointe/toe technique. (This category is not permitted in the Primary Level.)

PRODUCTION—Routine must utilize at least 15 dancers incorporating any style of dance that portrays a theme or storyline throughout. There will be no age division or level for Production entries. Props are allowed, but must be free standing. Hanging backdrops and special lighting may not be used. Fire, swords, knives and use of live animals are prohibited. Dancers must perform in their scheduled order unless permission is given for costume changes. Points will be deducted from routines that do not comply. If stage is littered during a routine, please be ready to clean it up immediately following the performance

SONG AND DANCE—Routine that contains both singing and dancing of any type. ADI will provide 1 standing microphone only.

TAP—Routine consisting primarily of tap technique.

In the above dance categories, only three gymnastic tricks are permissible. A deduction of 5 points will result for routines that do not comply. Minimum lip syncing and talking are permitted if a character is not portrayed.

AGE DI VI SI ONS

5-6, 7-8, 9-10, 11-12, 13-14, 15-16, 17-20, Adult 21 & Up. AGE DIVISIONS ARE DETERMINED AS OF **JANUARY 1, 2006**. The average age will determine the age group for Duet/Trios, Groups, and Lines. If average age ends in .5 or above, it is to be rounded up to the next age group. Ages and birth dates must appear on entry form. Contestants will be responsible for showing proof of age to contest directors should a question arise.

JUDGING

Contestants will be judged by a panel of previously selected judges and all entrants agree that all decisions of the judges are final. All entrants agree that the time, manner and method of judging the competition will be solely within the discretion of the directors and producers of AMERICAN DANCE INVITATIONAL COMPETITIVE

ADJUDICATION. Judging criteria will include overall performance, technical execution, and overall appearance. ADI awards each individual in a routine, pins designating medal standing. DECISION OF THE JUDGES IS FINAL. ALL TIES WILL BE BROKEN BY JUDGES DECISION. Awards will be based on the scores listed below. Judges will adjudicate on cassette recorders as the entries are being presented. These tapes are meant for the teachers use only. It is strongly recommended that teachers listen to the tapes before they share them with their students. The comments made on the tapes are the opinions and views of the individual judges and are not necessarily the views of ADI. Scores for each entry are located on the adjudication tape envelope and will be available to Studio Directors **ONLY** at the end of the entire competition. In the event that scoring packages are not picked-up at the competition, they will be discarded by the management. If a dance, costume or music is deemed inappropriate for family viewing, it will be scored lower by judges and possibly disqualified. Ties will not be broken for the regular competition. However, all ties will be broken for Special and High Score Awards.

ADDI TI ONAL GUI DELI NES

• A dancer may not compete in more than 2 Levels with the exception of the Production Category.

• If there is a mixture of different dancers and level abilities in a routine, this routine may only compete one age division lower than the oldest dancer in the entry.

• In mixed level routines, at least 50% of the dancers must be from the level that they are competing in.

• A routine will automatically be moved up to the next highest level if all judges on panel award a score that exceeds the maximum allowed points for that specific level. If the routine is moved to a new level/category, the act may repeat its' performance and be judged in the newly designated level and/or category.

• Food and drink are prohibited in the following areas: the competition area, backstage, seating sections of all auditoriums and dressing rooms. <u>YOU WILL BE</u> <u>ASKED TO TAKE ANY FOOD OUT-</u> <u>SIDE.</u>SMOKING IS PROHIBITED AT ALL TIMES. PLEASE ADVISE ALL PARENTS. AW ARDS WILL NOT BE GIVEN OUT UN-TIL ALL CHANGING AREAS ARE CLEANED AND SECURED BY OUR PER-SONNEL. POINT PENALTIES MAY AP-PLY IF AREAS ARE LEFT UNCLEAN.

• Registration by entry deadline is strongly encouraged. Entry date is the date the entries **MUST** be received in our offices **NOT** the postmark date. ADI **LIMITS** the entries for each weekend to **275** entries. Every schedule is set up based solely on the breakdown of entries by solos, duo/trios, groups and lines for a particular location. The schedule is created so that an event can run on time and end at a reasonable hour. The schedule could run later on Saturday.

• ADI does not accept entries over the phone or by email. WE DO NOT ACCEPT PERSONAL CHECKS.

NEDT/ NEW ENGLAND DANCE TEAM

This event is a ONE day event open ONLY to middle and high school dance teams throughout the New England area. Criteria and awards will be the same as for our ADI events except that it will only be open to duo through class. Check the schedule for this event.

DANZ4KIDZ

This event is a **ONE** day event open **ONLY** to students age 13 and under. Criteria and awards will be the same as for our ADI events open to solo through class. Check the schedule for this event. The perfect event for **PRIMARY AND INTERMEDIATE** students to feel challenged and motivated to succeed in their dance education. **AGE AVERAGES DO NOT APPLY FOR THIS EVENT.** Check the schedule for this event.
